

ove and how many wheels

In DT we are looking at moving vehicles.

We will look at how different vehicles move and how many wheels they may have. Wheels are attached to an axle. The axle moves inside an axle holder. The axle holder is attached to the body of the vehicle or toy. We will then be designing our own moving vehicle and then making it.

Key words

- Axle- A long straight rod which connects to a rotating part (e.g. the wheels of a car).
- Axle holder—The part of a mechanism which holds the axle steady.
- Mechanism Parts of an object that move together to make something work.
- Wheel A circular object that turns round. It can be fixed to a vehicle like a car or a bicycle to allow the vehicle to move easily over the ground.
