ADVENT TERM

Pupils will be learning:

CREATED AND LOVED BY GOD

Religious Understanding

This unit explores the Gospel story Jairus' daughter in various creative and reflective ways. Through story and discussion, children will learn that they are designed for a purpose and how they should live in light of this. A second session unpacks the Sacraments of Baptism and Reconciliation as a foretaste of heaven and a wonderful part of our relationship with God.

Suggested activities for home:

Spend a little extra time with your child before bedtime, helping them relax and reminding them of God's love for them through your extra attention. You might like to read a book together, encourage them to say thank you for the day and sorry for anything that wasn't very loving and perhaps finish with a decade of the rosary. Allow time for any conversation that arises.

Pupils will be learning:

Me, My Body, My Health

In this Unit, pupils will learn to celebrate similarities and differences, and to appreciate and look after their bodies as gifts from God. Teaching also covers specific physical and emotional changes during puberty, and that growing from boys and girls to men and women is part of God's loving plan for creation.

Suggested activities for home:

Invite your child to ask any questions they have about puberty, and/or describe some of your own experiences going through puberty. Particularly discuss their feelings about how their bodies will change and if there is anything you can do to help them feel prepared for it. Allow space for any discussions that arise.

This might be a good opportunity to show girls where sanitary items are stored in the house and demonstrate how they are used.

LENT TERM

Pupils will be learning:

CREATED AND LOVED BY GOD (CONTINUED)

Emotional Well-being

This unit helps pupils to understand the difference between feelings and actions, how to manage them and what they can do to help themselves stay emotionally healthy. In this Unit, media is discussed as a 'fake reality' and God's love for us is presented as a better basis for our self-confidence. Finally, pupils will identify unacceptable behaviours and learn to build resilience against negative feelings by practising thankfulness.

Suggested activities for home:

Encourage your child to keep a feelings diary for the week. In a notebook, they should use drawings, emojis or words to record how they felt at different times each day. Your child can review this by themselves and think about why they felt those feelings. They might also wish to share it with you.

This unit explores the miraculous nature of human conception and birth and offers an opportunity for thanksgiving. Sexual intercourse is **not** discussed in this session.

Suggested activities for home:

Use a calendar to highlight different times for events in our lives. Discuss birthdays and celebrations marked on the calendar and how you/your child feels when these days happen. Also mark dates like Remembrance Day, or perhaps the anniversary of the passing of a loved one and talk about how we might make time to think about, remember and pray for those who have died.

PENTECOST TERM

Pupils will be learning:

CREATED TO LOVE OTHERS

Religious Understanding

Pupils will learn about the parable of The Prodigal Son, showing that God loves us, and nothing we can do will stop Him from loving us. Pupils will also learn about different types of sin, and the importance of forgiveness in relationships.

Pupils will be learning:

Keeping Safe

Pupils will be introduced to the term 'abuse' and discuss different kinds of abuse, including sexual abuse and Female Genital Mutilation (FGM), here referred to as 'abuse of private parts'. Pupils will be asked to think of trusted adults that they can talk to about any issues they may face.

CREATED TO LIVE IN COMMUNITY

Religious Understanding

This unit explores in greater detail the community aspect of the Trinity and encourages children to think about what the Trinity means to them and how as they were made in God's image, they too are created to live in community.

Next time you are at your church, stay behind a little afterwards and see if you can find any of these things: The symbol of a fish – This was a secret symbol of Christianity used at times of persecution; The baptismal font; Stations of the cross; Statues or pictures of the saint to whom your Parish Church is dedicated; Tabernacle; Candles: how many, where, why there?

Pupils will be learning:

Living in the Wider World

Pupils will learn some of the principles of Catholic Social Teaching from Together For The Common Good, which will help them to live in communities in the way God intends. Teaching includes the common good, the human person, social relationships and stewardship.

Suggested activities for home:

Talk to your child about the advantages and disadvantages of different types of money (e.g. cash, bank cards, cheques, credit cards, gift vouchers etc.), and the importance of keeping all forms of money safe. Highlight that some ways of using money are more secure than others and you might like to draw your child's attention to safeguards such as spending limits, or PIN numbers/passwords/signatures etc.
