Religious Understanding

Pupils hear the story of creation, where God created the earth, sea, stars, plants, animals and humans. The five-story sessions encourage pupils to creatively explore this topic and help them to deeply know that they are created by God out of love and for love.

Suggested activities for home:

Pupils will be learning:

Pupils will learn about their uniqueness in real terms, including celebrating differences and individual gifts, talents and abilities. They will learn about looking after and using their God-given bodies and develop their vocabulary around this topic.

Pupils will learn about likes, dislikes and self-acceptance. They will learn how to describe different feelings, both good and bad. Finally, they will learn that actions have consequences; that when we make mistakes we should say sorry and ask for forgiveness.

Pupils will be learning:

CREATED AND LOVED BY GOD (CONTINUED)

Life Cycles

Pupils will explore the natural human cycle of life, focusing on what children can remember about their development so far and what they know will happen as they get older. Pupils will also recall changes that came with starting school and identify changes to come – learning that they can cope with change. This is underpinned by the religious understanding that growing up is part of God's plan for our lives and that we are loved by Him at every life stage.

Religious Understanding

This unit helps pupils to understand why the Bible is so special to Christians, and secondly helps pupils to act out the Gospel account of Jesus washing His disciples' feet, showing that He loves us and is a role model for us to copy in loving one another.

Suggested activities for home:

In this unit pupils are challenged to follow in the footsteps of Jesus by showing His love to those around them. Praise them when they are kind and caring at home, and perhaps pray together, thanking God for His love and asking for His help to live like Jesus.

Pupils will be learning:

Personal Relationships

Pupils will expand their vocabulary by applying names to different family/friend relationships, consider positive/negative behaviour in relationships and learn to look to Jesus as their role model for a good friend. Pupils will learn to resolve conflict and the importance of asking for forgiveness: that when we hurt others, we also hurt Jesus – but that Jesus teaches us how to forgive ourselves and others.

Pupils will learn about medicine safety and the people who help us in. All these topics are underpinned by the religious teaching that we are created and loved by God, with bodies and minds that He wants us to keep safe.

Religious Understanding

This unit introduces in a very simple way the concept of the Trinity, where God is three-in-one and each part loves the others and loves us. Pupils will come to understand that as we are made in the image of God, we are designed to love God and love one another in our wider communities too. Through the story of Jesus feeding the 5000 with just the humble offering of a small boy, pupils will learn that our loving actions can be used by God to do incredible things.

This unit helps pupils learn about the responsibilities they have to people, places and the planet now and increasingly as they get older. Pupils will begin to explore the working world of jobs, focusing on their current strengths and aspirations. Money is also introduced, with both underpinned by the religious understanding that our true value comes from God.

Suggested activities for home:

Money comes in all shapes and sizes and perhaps nowadays people generally use less cash than in the past. However, it is important for pupils to be able to recognise coins and notes as well as understand that there are other ways to pay, e.g. by using a bank card or mobile app. Allow your child to handle real money and recognise coins by their colour, shape and size. Show that coins and notes have numbers on them to represent their value. Extend this by making a game of asking your child to point to the most valuable coin or order the coins. There are plenty of board games available that would also reinforce money and shopping skills.
